

1.1 Where do I get help

1.1.1 Moving on to education, employment or training

Schools and colleges can provide careers advice and guidance for their students and the National Careers Service provides careers information and advice for everyone (details below)

Learning Partnership West (Connexions) provide targeted information, advice, guidance and support services for young people in vulnerable groups, to help them move on to education, employment or training. 1.2 What are my options?

1.2.1 Continuing Education

This will depend upon what level you wish to continue your studies

The table below represents a brief guide

Qualification level	Qualifications needed to study at this level
Entry level	Foundation learning Foundation skills
Level 1	GCSE grades D-G
Level 2	GCSE grades A*-C
Level 3	A Levels BTEC

1.2.2 Staying at your existing school

Some students will leave school after Year 11 but some schools offer post 16/6th form provision. Post 16 provision is available for young people who are not ready to leave school in both special schools; this must be agreed by the Local Authority. Whilst at school, the young person continues to have a Statement of Special Educational Needs and this will continued to be reviewed annually to ensure that the placement remains appropriate.

Continuing in 6th form at your existing mainstream school will mainly depend upon the academic standards that are required for A' levels or level 2/ 3 courses. Again if you have a Statement of Special Educational Need this will continue until you leave the 6th form.

1.2.3 Continuing Education at a Local Further Education College

All Further Education colleges offer a range of courses including Foundation Learning which can include courses at Pre-Entry, Entry level and Level 1 to level 3. The Learning Partnership West (Connexions Personal Adviser) will help to provide information about a student's needs in a report titled a Section139a which, in conjunction with the college's own assessment, will ensure that you are given the necessary support.

1.2.4 Continuing Education with an Independent Specialist Provider

This option is only a possibility at local FE Colleges if local provision is not suitable. Applicants need to meet specialist provider entry criteria and funding has to be agreed by the Local Authority.

The guidelines issued by Bath and North East Somerset Council states:

"We believe that most students with Learning Disabilities or Disabilities benefit from attending local education or training provision, alongside their peers, as it provides a local network of support that often remains in place well after the student leaves education. It also provides continued contact with family and friends."

1.2.5 Internships/ Project Search

The Project offers 12 month internships with a large local employer. The internship is split between working as a member of staff (with job coaching) within the organisation and an on-site classroom where interns learn employment skills

The end goal is for each student to achieve employment using the skills they have acquired during the year
