world arrives in Bath from 14th June, closing with a family-friendly celebration, marking the grand finale of a wild adventure along the River Avon in Royal Victoria Park on 25th June.

The 25th June is the climax of two weeks of river-themed events running along the Avon from Bristol to Bath. This is the first time in its 14-year history the Festival has celebrated the region's waterscapes. The Bath finale event will open with a procession led by a willow sculpture portraying the Spirit of the Avon, which will wind its way to the main event in Royal Victoria Park.

An array of national and local organisations will flock to the park for a family-friendly day of hands-on activities, innovative arts and inspiring entertainment designed to showcase the natural world.

Project Updates

Water Space Study

The Boaters Survey 2016 has just been launched. It will run for six weeks **from 24th May to 4th July 2016**, and will look at how far live-aboard boaters travel, the type and size of crafts used, and the range of facilities they need whilst on the canal and river in the B&NES area. Results will be made available to the Bath WaterSpace project to enable facilities such as water points, sewage disposal and mooring areas to be planned and provided.

The survey will be carried out by Consultancy Atkins Plc on behalf of the newly formed Bath WaterSpace Partnership (made up of B&NES Council, Canal & River Trust, the Environment Agency and Wessex Water). The survey will help the partners better understand what the needs are for live-aboard boaters and how they can be better provided for.

Bathampton Riverside Community Project

A visit was made to the Bathampton Riverside Community project where volunteers from both Batheaston and Bathampton have been working tirelessly to improve the appearance of the riverside area, and where new benches and community noticeboards have now been installed. It is looking great, and local volunteers have plenty more ideas for consideration as part of the WaterSpace project. This capital project was funded by B&NES Council's River Corridor Fund.

Volunteers Restore Dundas Aqueduct Toll House

Over the last year, volunteers working with the Canal & River Trust have restored a nineteenth-century toll house at Dundas Aqueduct on the

Kennet & Avon Canal in order to create a welcome station for people visiting the area and historic structure.

Dundas Aqueduct, Kennet & Avon Canal provides a beautiful sight, it was built by renowned waterway engineer John Rennie to take the canal over the River Avon, and was the first canal structure to be designated as a Scheduled Ancient Monument in the country.

The Toll House originally took fees from boats passing from one waterway to the other, but it will now be used as a welcome point for the many visitors of the area.

Huge congratulations to everyone involved – you have given new life to this beautiful building!

River Safety Ladders

Works are due to commence to repair the River Safety Ladders to the rear of Bath Spa Railway Station in June/July 2016. This capital project was funded by B&NES Council's River Corridor Fund.
