Footpath off Lyncombe Vale Road, Bath

Thank you for your letter of 13th September 1983, and I note your comments.

With respect to signposting the paths I would suggest that two signposts are erected at the points where the paths leave the metalled road (as per our responsibilities under the Countryside Act 1968, s.27). These signs would be of the standard design used in Avon of a green background with white wording "public footpath" and a white logo of a person walking.

The signposting of paths within woods presents more of a problem and I would suggest that the above signs are inappropriate. As an alternative I propose that waymarks, (as per enclosed leaflet), are painted onto trees in appropriate positions along the routes of the paths.

I trust that you will convey this information to your clients. Upon receipt of your favourable agreement I will organise the work to be done as soon as possible. Thank you for your assistance in this matter.
