Dear Sir,

LYNCOMBE VALE FARM, PLOUGHING OF  
PUBLIC FOOTPATH.  
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My Assistant informs me that you have now ploughed the above footpath, in accordance with your letter to the Town Clerk, and that you have replaced the posts marking the footpath.

The surface, however, is far from satisfactory, and while in fine weather, it is reasonably convenient for the exercise of the public right of way, rain would cause it to turn to mud, and it would be impassable without collecting a considerable amount of mud on one's shoes and clothing.

I would suggest that as well as treating the surface in some manner, you move the posts which are now only two feet apart, to a distance of three feet.

Lyncombe Vale Farm - Ploughing of public  
Footpath.

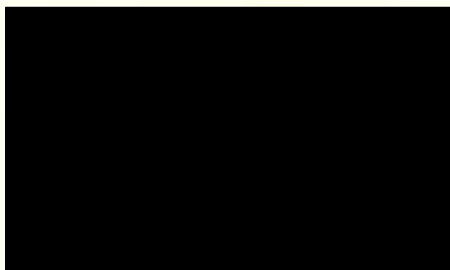
I am in receipt of your letter of the 17th instant giving notice of your intention to plough the field across which runs the public footpath linking Foxhill with Lyncombe Vale. I take it that it is your intention to plough the path at the same time as you are ploughing the remainder of the field, and I am accordingly accepting your letter as the requisite seven days notice under Section 56 of the National Parks and Access to Countryside Act, 1949 for this purpose.

I would, however, draw your attention to Section 26(3) of that Act which provides that where a public path is ploughed after the necessary notice has been given, the occupier of the land shall as soon as may be after the ploughing is completed make good the surface of the path so as to make it reasonably convenient for the exercise of the public right of way. Any person who fails to comply with this provision is liable on summary conviction to a fine not exceeding £10.

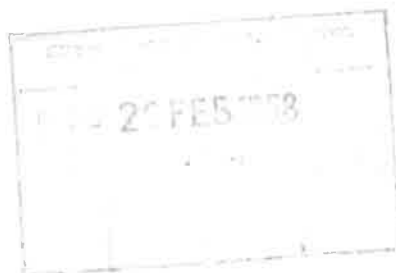
Dear Sir,

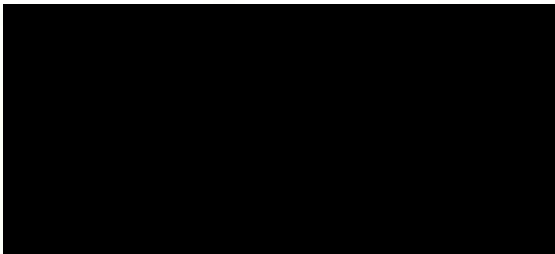
