

FOR THE ATTENTION OF ALL PUBLIC FOOTPATH USERS

Bath and North East Somerset Council are proposing to change the Public Rights of Way network in respect of public footpath BA5/22 at Langridge Lane, Langridge in the Parish of Charlcombe.

The general effect of the proposal is shown on the attached Plan. The section of public footpath BA5/22 from point A on the Plan via point D to point C would be stopped up and is shown as a solid red line on the Plan. The proposed new line runs from point A via point B to point C and is shown as a solid green line on the Plan.

The changes would be achieved by way of a diversion order made under section 119 of the Highways Act 1980 ('the Act'). These changes are proposed in the interests of the landowner in order to improve farming processes and direct the walker away from farm buildings and machinery. It is proposed to authorise a kissing gate at point B to prevent the ingress and egress of livestock, under section 147 of the Act. The proposed route is over a less steep incline and allows greater views of the countryside to the east.
