

## Stowey Sutton Neighbourhood Plan Information Statement

A referendum relating to the adoption of Stowey Sutton Neighbourhood Plan will be held on Friday 7 August 2015.

The question which will be asked in the referendum is:

'Do you want Bath & North East Somerset Council to use the neighbourhood plan for Stowey Sutton to help it decide planning applications in the neighbourhood area?'

The referendum area is identical to the area which has been designated as the Stowey Sutton Neighbourhood Plan Area, and is identified on the map included with this information statement.

A person is entitled to vote in the referendum if:

- he or she is entitled to vote in a local government election in the referendum area; and
- his or her qualifying address for the election is in the referendum area. A person's qualifying address is, in relation to a person registered in the register of electors, the address in respect of which he or she is entitled to be so registered.

The referendum expenses limit is £2,428.26. The number of persons entitled to vote in the referendum by reference to which that limit has been calculated is 1,123.

The referendum will be conducted in accordance with procedures which are similar to those used at local government elections.
