

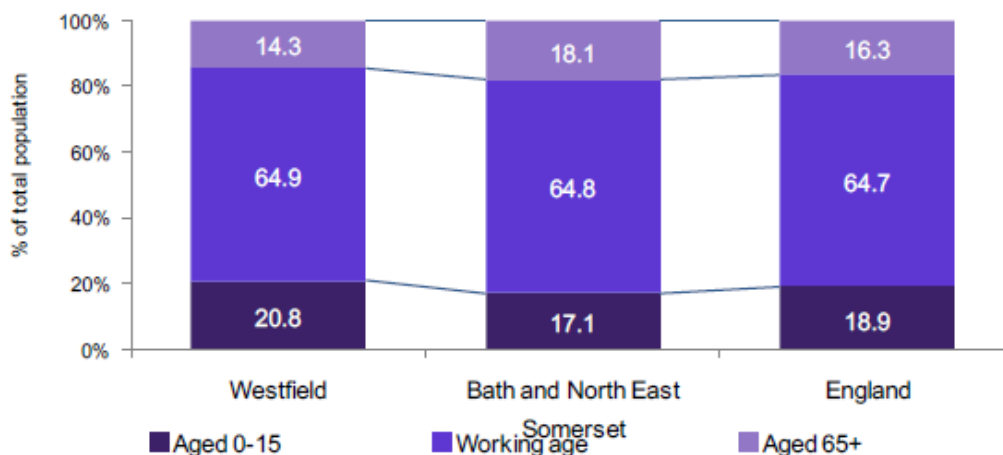

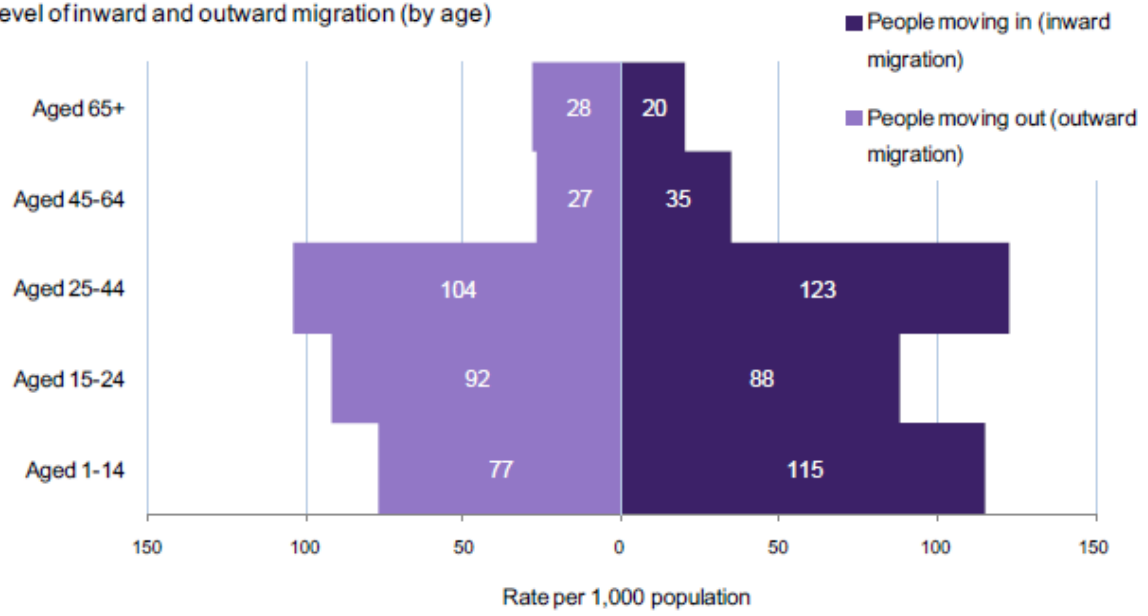


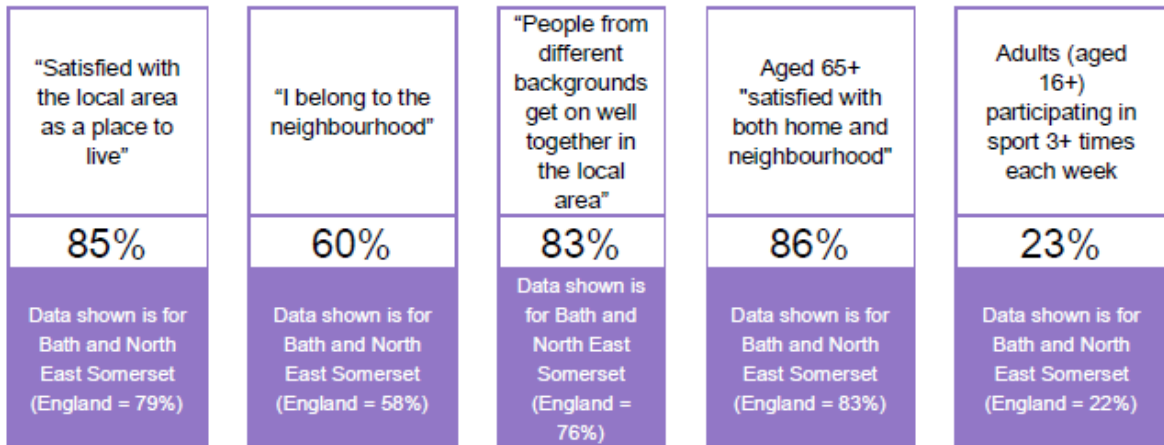
Population by age



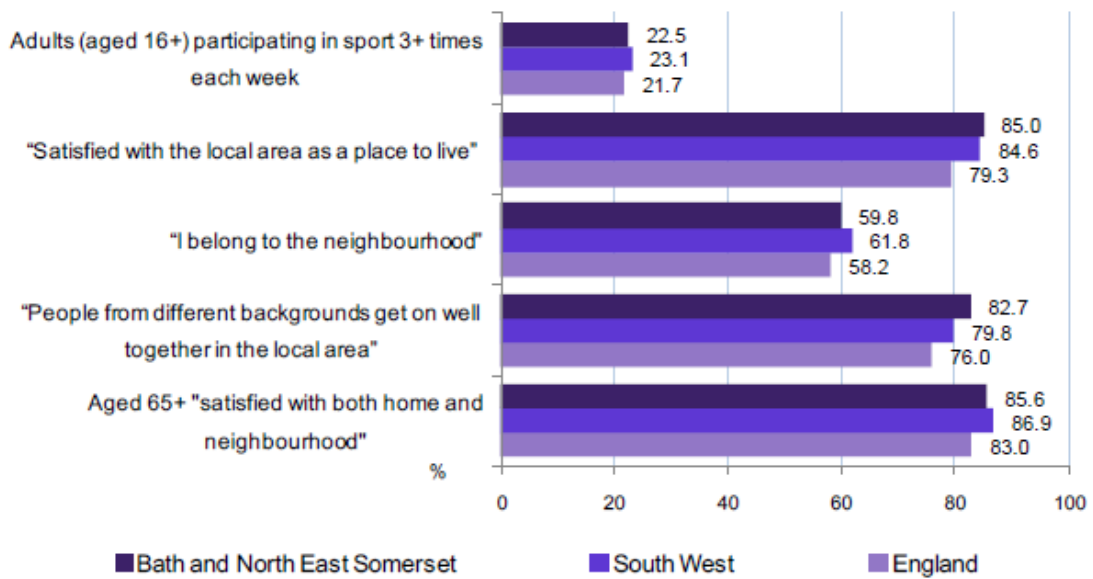

Level of inward and outward migration (by age)



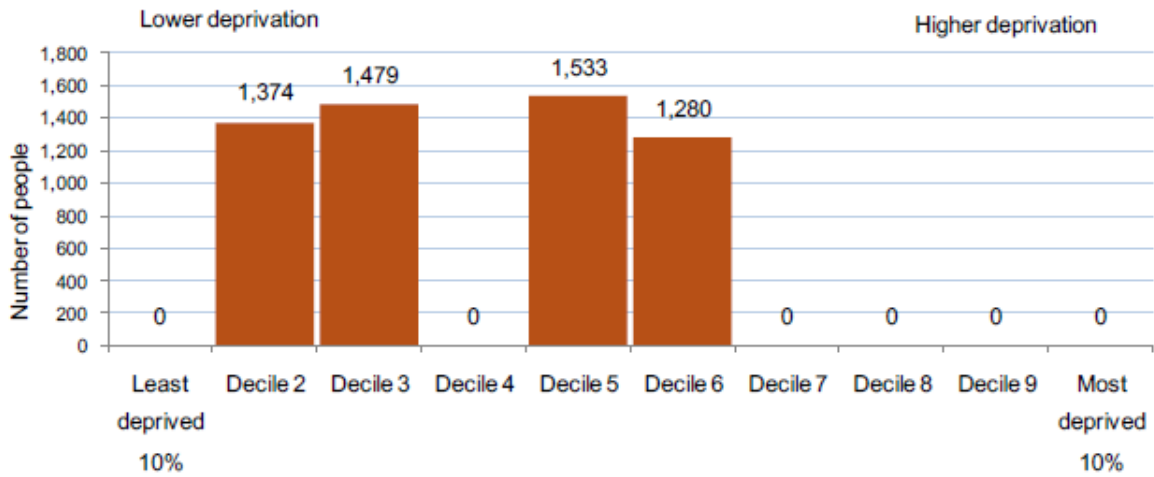

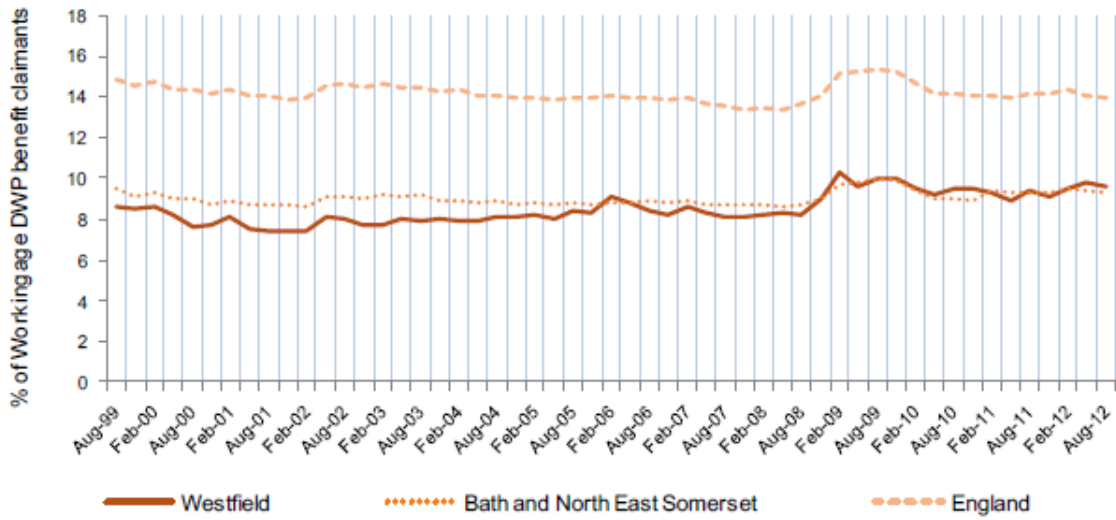

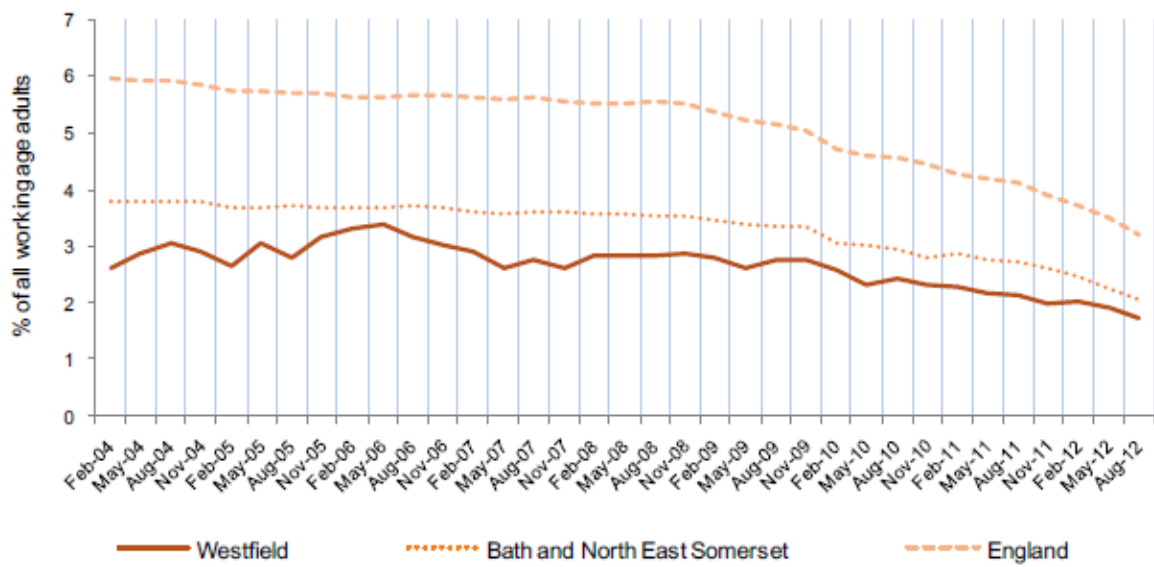

Weekly household earnings (£)



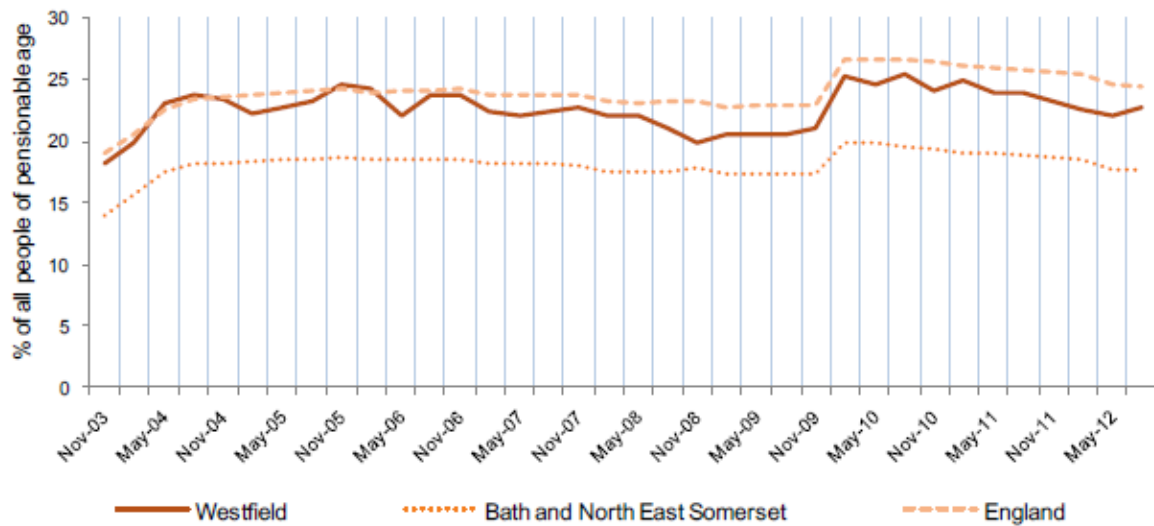

Pension Credit claimants

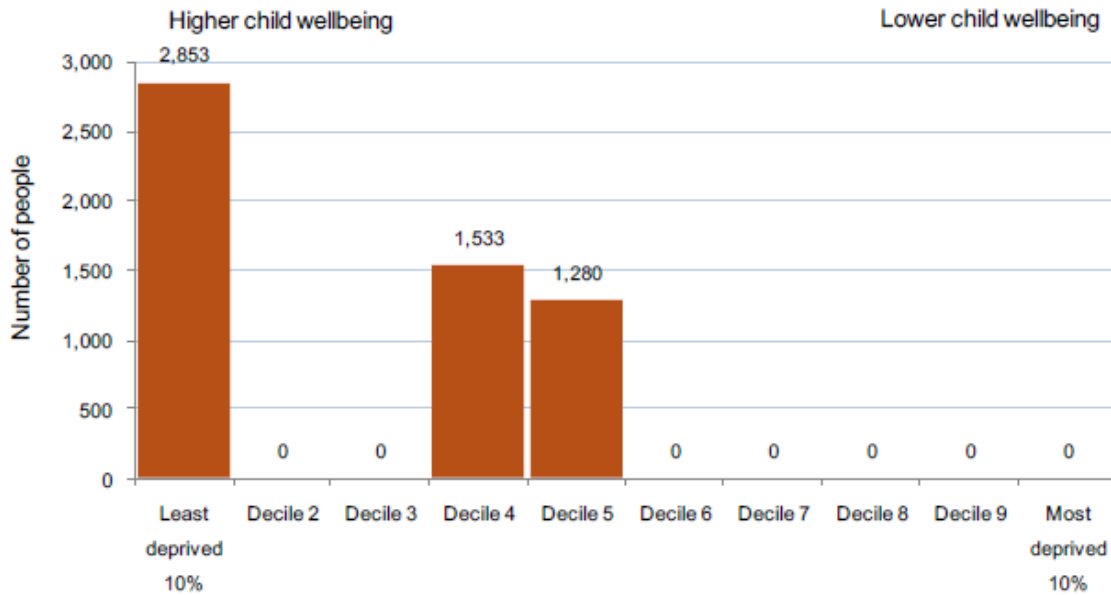

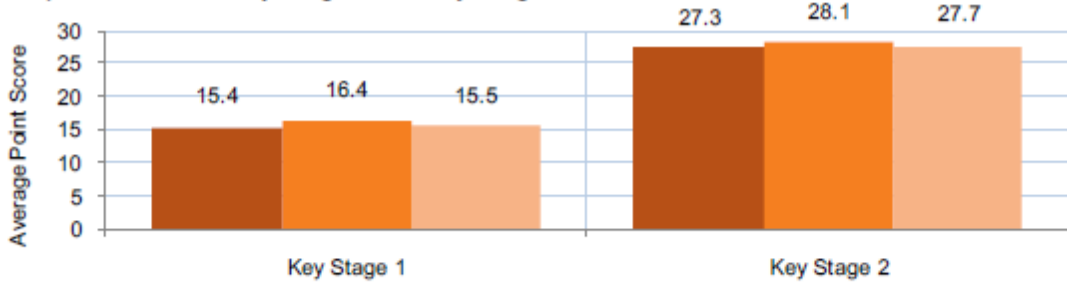

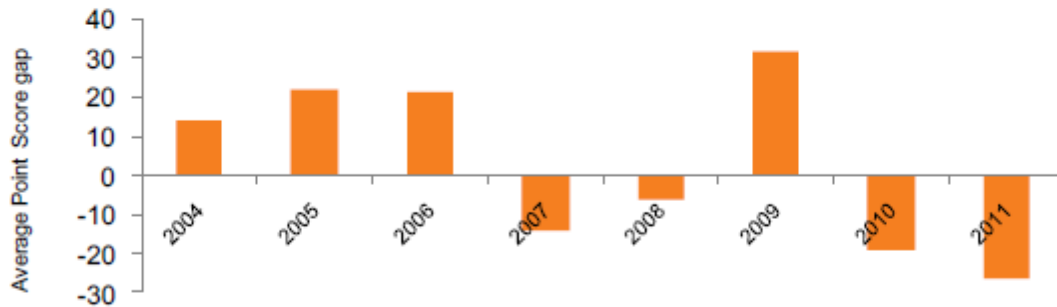
Pupil attainment at Key Stage 1 and Key Stage 2

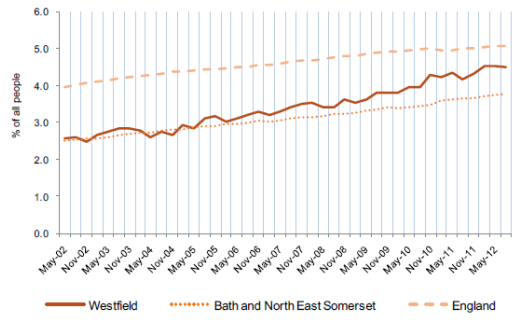

Gap in pupil attainment at Key stage 4 (difference from the National average)

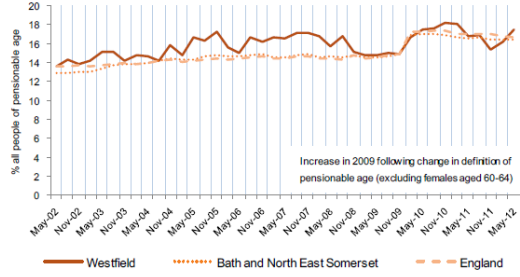

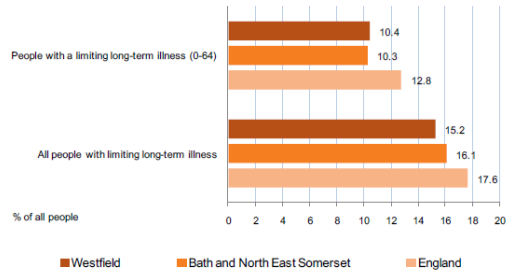
Adults with a disability (receiving Disability Living Allowance)

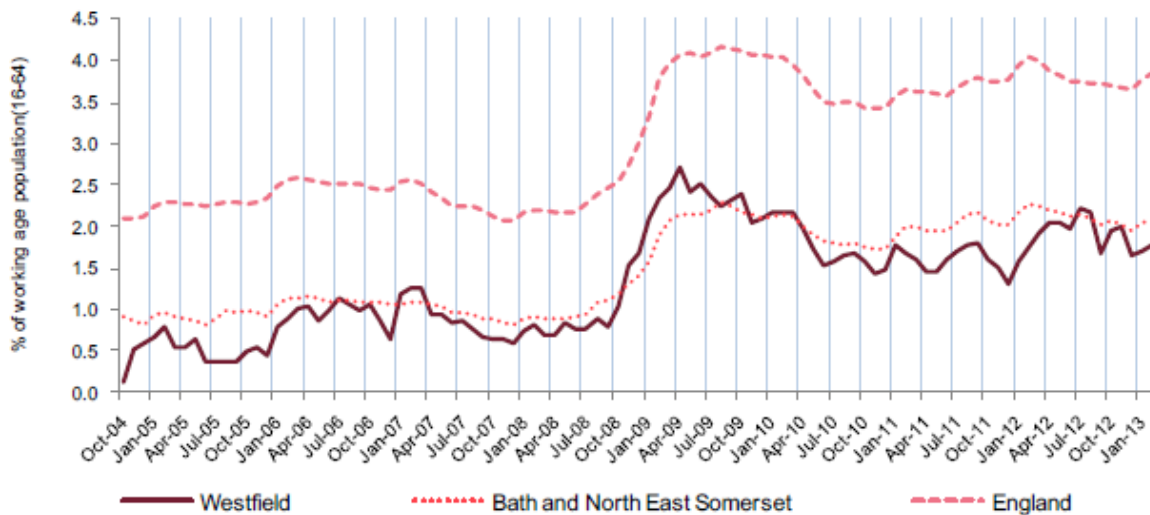

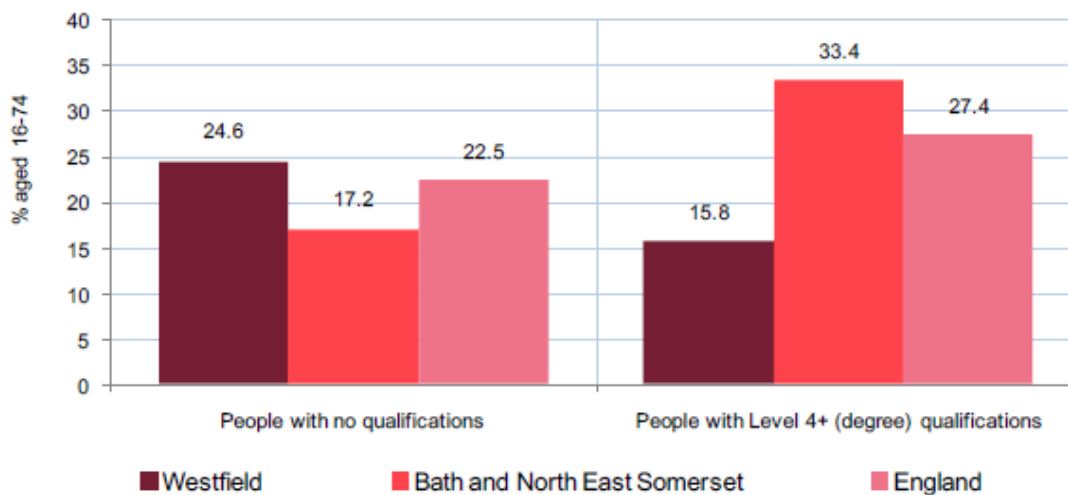

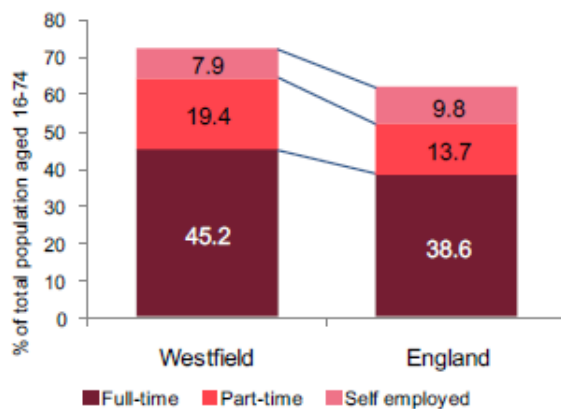

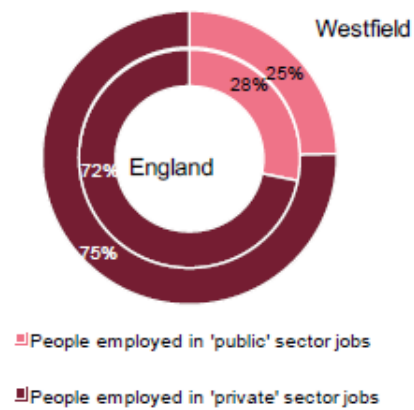

People employed in public and private sector jobs

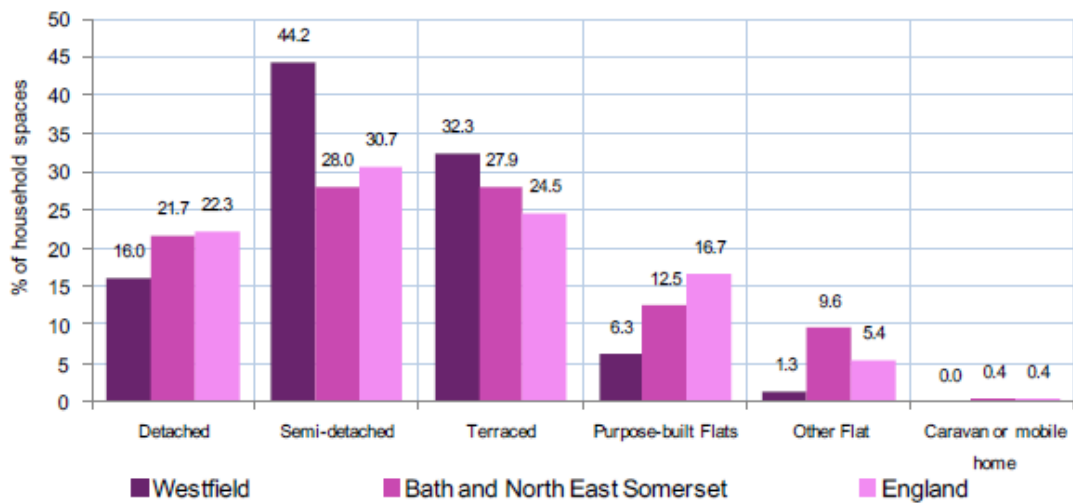

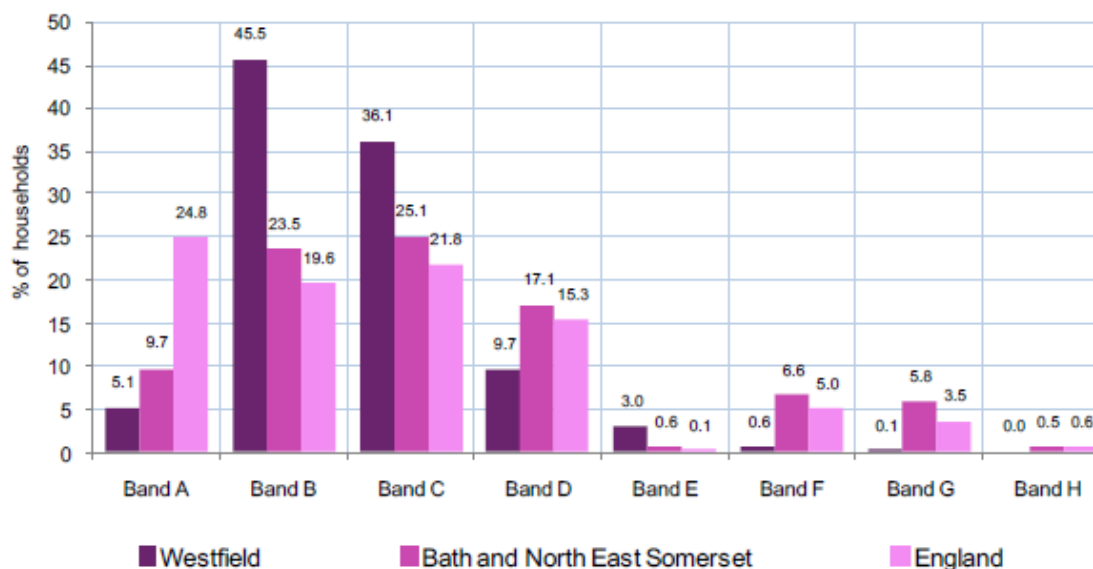
Housing tenure breakdowns

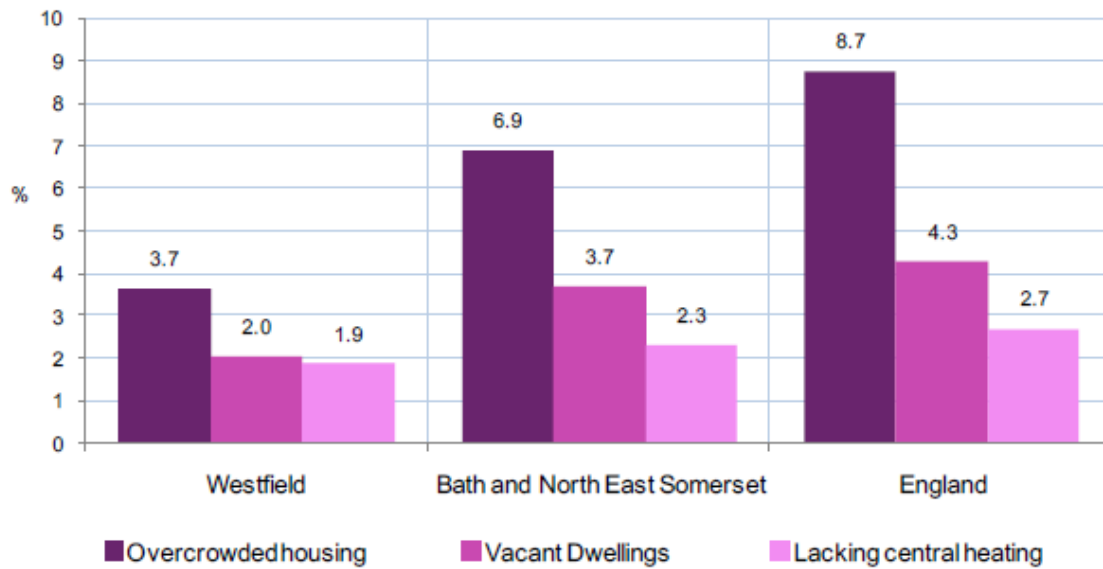
Dwelling stock by council tax band

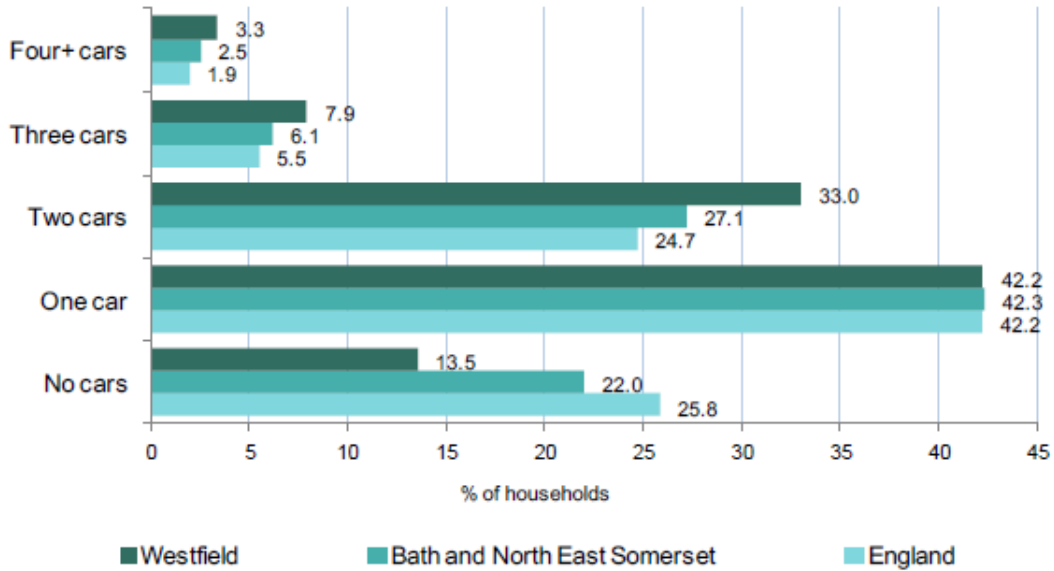

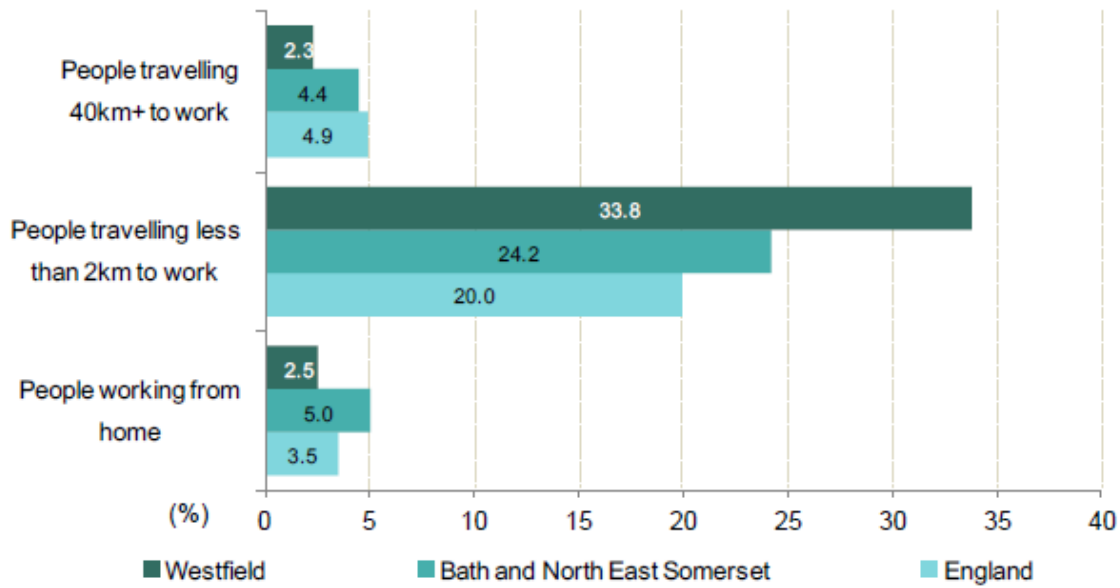
Car ownership

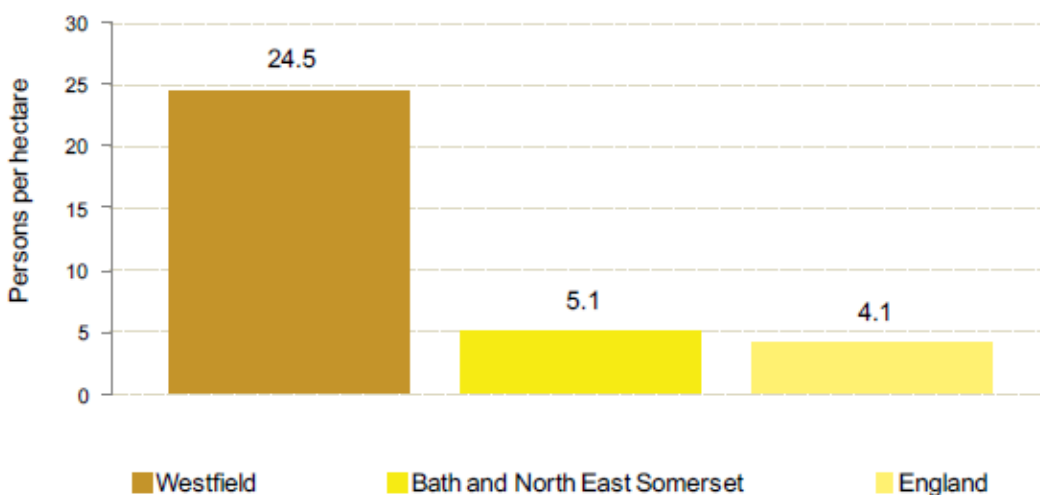
