Further to my letter of 3rd July, 1980, with which I enclosed a copy of the Direction made by the City Council under Article 4 in respect of land adjacent to Bath City Football Club, Dominion Road, Twerton, I would now inform you that this Direction has been confirmed by the Secretary of State for the Environment with effect from the 17th November, 1980.

The effect of the Direction is that any development falling within Class IV.2 of Schedule 1 of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977 should not be carried out on the land unless permission is granted on an express application for planning permission.



TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING GENERAL DEVELOPMENT ORDER 1977

FACE

DIRECTION UNDER ARTICLE 4(1)

WHEREAS the Bath City Council (hereinafter called "the Council"), being the local planning authority for the City of Bath, are satisfied that it is expedient that particular development of the class specified in the Schedule hereto (being development falling within Class IV.2 of the Schedule 1 to the Order hereinafter referred to) should not be carried out in the particular area hereinafter specified unless permission is granted on an application in that behalf;

AND WHEREAS it is the opinion of the Council that development of the class specified in the Schedule hereto would constitute a threat to the amenities of their area.

NOW THEREFORE the Council, in pursuance of their powers under Article 4(1) of the Town and Country Planning General Development Order 1977, HEREBY DIRECT that the permission granted by Article 3 of the said Order shall not apply to the particular development specified in the Schedule hereto in the area shown coloured pink on the map TP 1 attached hereto.

This Direction shall remain in force for six months from the date on which it is made and shall then expire unless it has before the termination of the said six months been approved by the Secretary of State for the Environment.

SCHEDULE

The use of land (other than a building or curtilage of a building) for the purpose of the holding of markets on not more that 14 days in total in any calender year, and the erection or placing of moveable structures on the land for the purposes of that use.
