We are seeing an increased demand for use of our outside court now that the resurfacing has been completed, particularly from the local community. We are the only such facility in the centre of Bath offering free access to young people. It is also well-used by our twice-weekly youth sessions. LED lighting will not only further improve its appearance but help us continue to afford to make it available at low or no cost for community use.

An improved facility for community use and a lower carbon footprint for the area.

It is a new project although it links to the CIL-funded resurfacing grant award which was awarded a year ago.

We have previously received funding for our youth services and for new Annexe doors. Most relevant, though, is that we were awarded CIL funding for the resurfacing of our outside court (MUGA). This was completed last May.

It is an infrastructure improvement that responds to growing demand for such a facility both from new residents and existing ones attracted by the new 2G surface. Much of the housing in the area is flat based with little or no outside space.

For our re-surfacing submission we described the continuing growth in residential and student living in the area and how this has contributed to a growing demand for leisure facilities. For example, recent student developments in Green Park Road and James Street West and housing schemes for the retired in the Bath Leat development, a mixed residential development proposed for the former Homebase site and, close to the Centre, new residential units both in the former church on Chapel Row and in new flats on Cumberland Row. There is a pending application for a residential conversion of the Colorworks offices on Monmouth Place and additional housing planned for the existing recycling centre off the Upper Bristol Road.

Through increased usage but primarily by lower running costs. Over recent years, with the support of B&NES and Bath & West Community Energy, we have replaced all other lighting both inside and outside with LED units. This will be the final step towards making our lighting 100% LED.
