
(PENNYQUICK HILL, BATH) (50 M.P.H. SPEED LIMIT) (VARIATION NO.1)
ORDER 202-

NOTICE is given that the Bath and North East Somerset Council proposes to make an order under provisions contained in the Road Traffic Regulation Act 1984, the effect of which will be that it is prohibited to drive a motor vehicle at a speed exceeding 40 miles per hour on the lengths of road shown in the schedule to this notice.

Full details of the proposals are contained in the draft order, which together with a map and a Statement of the Council's Reasons for proposing to make the order may be inspected at; The One Stop Shops at 3-4 Manvers Street, Bath and at Keynsham Civic Centre, Market Walk, Keynsham during normal office hours.
